SQA EXAMS

Many of our senior phase pupils will be experiencing exams during late April and May. The preparations by the school and the Scottish Qualifications Authority are underway to help ensure that the whole exam session goes through without issue. Developing the Young Workforce (DYW) Update

DYW's role is to support our young people to prepare for the world of work and to provide inspirational opportunities for young people to help them understand and develop the skills they need to succeed. During Scottish Apprenticeship Week (2-6th March) our pupils engaged in a series of workshops. Here's a round up of events that our pupils experienced:

Ocean Generation delivered workshops to S1, S2 and primary on story telling skills and to learn about the management and conservation of our seas.

Bank of Scotland delivered workshops to S2 up to S6 on financial management and financial wellbeing skills.

Local employers, BSW, Shiel buses and Scottish Sea Farms delivered presentations and hosted a Q+A session for S5 and 6 pupils to help raise awareness of some of the many apprenticeship programmes available in the local community.

LIVE N LEARN WORKSHOPS

On 18 March, Renee Le Blanc from Live n Learn delivered another study skills workshops to S4-6 and an aspirational workshop to S3. She also delivered staff training.

Pupils have a code to log in to the Live n Learn website to access study support materials.

The 4 step process to revise information is: UNDERSTAND, CONDENSE, MEMORISE, REVIEW.

Suggested strategies to support the steps are also outlined below.

UNDERSTAND

Take the time to think about what you're trying to grasp. How does it relate to you? Are you listening in class? If you don't get it yet, then ask for help.

CONDENSE

It's not possible to remember everything. Make it smaller and more manageable with coloured notes, mind maps or post it notes to organise key points.

MEMORISE

Rather than just rereading your notes, make things more memorable by using your imagination with funny stories, rhymes or songs that help you relate to the topic.

REVIEW

Break the forgetting curve! Make time to come back and review after a day, then a week and a month to help it stick in your long term memory. Test yourself or ask someone to test you, don't let all your hard work drain away.

MOUNTAIN LEARNING FESTIVAL

The sun shone as pupils at Kinlochleven learned from local outdoor experts.

p3-7 heard from five local experts in their fields on a variety of themes. Local photographer, Tim Perkins explained the history of mountain photography as well as how the first photos are showing the recline of glaciers comparing with photos taken recently in The Alps and Himalayas. Local Gaelic heritage expert, Kate Langhorme described local folklore about the Vikings as well as place names on maps describing folklore giants and heroes.

NTS Rangers, accompanied by local Ecologist Alison Stewart, did sessions explaining their work through a game showing plant identification, grids and coordinates, team work and habitat improvements-all done in a fun way. The children had a fantastic morning and have asked for it to be repeated with the older children now interested in taking up photography.



THE PUGGY LINE, BY MAYA MARKIEWICZ S1

AS PART OF OUR COURSE, MILADA PROKOP ORGANISED A TRIP LAST WEDNESDAY FOR MRS JANZEN AND MRS MELDRUM TO TAKE US ON. WE WALKED ALONG THE PUGGY LINE AND WE ARE STARTING TO LEARN ABOUT PART OF THE HISTORY OF KINLOCHLEVEN.

THE PUGGY LINE IS A <u>NARROW-GAUGE RAILWAY</u> APPROXIMATELY A MILE LONG LINKED THE PIER ON THE SOUTHERN SHORE OF LOCH LEVEN AND THE SMELTER, WHICH OPERATED BETWEEN 1906 AND 1960. IT WAS DOUBLE TRACK WITH A WIDTH OF 3 FEET AND AN OVERHEAD ELECTRIC POWER, MAKING IT THE FIRST ELECTRIC RAILWAY IN SCOTLAND.

FROM SHIP TO FACTORY - ALUMINUM WAS TRANSPORTED TO MAKE ALUMINIUM METAL,
USING A FOUR-WHEELED ELECTRIC LOCOMOTIVES (TRAM)

ALUMINIUM IS FROM A CLAY-LIKE MINERAL CALLED <u>BAUXITE</u>, WHOSE PROPERTIES WERE FIRST UNDERSTOOD IN 1821. THIS CAN BE REFINED TO PRODUCE <u>ALUMINA</u> BY THE <u>BAYER PROCESS</u>, WHICH IS THEN REDUCED TO THE METAL <u>ALUMINIUM</u>.

A PIER WAS CONSTRUCTED ON THE SOUTHERN SHORE OF LOCH LEVEN TO ASSIST THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE HYDROELECTRIC SCHEME AND ALUMINIUM SMELTER. A NARROW-GAUGE RAILWAY APPROXIMATELY ONE MILE (1.5 KILOMETRES) LONG LINKED THE PIER AND THE SMELTER.

P5-7 GAELIC LESSONS



THE BLACKCURRANT AND BLUEBERRY BUSHES HAVE BEEN CLEARED OF WEEDS AND TRANSPLANTED BARE ROOT INTO A NEWLY PREPARED SECOND BED, WHERE WE HOPE THEY WILL THRIVE AND PROVIDE US WITH MUCH-LOVED BERRIES THIS SUMMER.

TRAVIS PERKINS DELIVERED TWO TONNES OF TOPSOIL, WHICH WE'VE SPREAD EVENLY ACROSS THE BEDS. THE STUDENTS HAVE DECIDED ON A FOUR-YEAR CROP ROTATION, AND WE'VE SUBMITTED OUR SEED ORDER—EXCITINGLY, WE'VE STARTED PLANTING LEGUMES (PEAS AND BEANS). POTATOES ARE ON ORDER. FIRST SOWING OF CARROTS HAS ALSO BEEN DONE.






GLENCOE MUSEUM RENOVATION - S2 ART PROJECT.
